Proposed

- **For promotion to the next class, a child should have attended minimum 75% of the total number of working days of his/her class in the school.**
- Students of LKG, UKG, Class I and II will be assessed continuously and no examination will be conducted for them.
- Students of Class III to VIII will be assessed twice in an academic year and the Assessment Structure and examination for Classes III to VIII comprises of two terms- Term 1 and 2 as explained below:

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- Students of Class IX to X will be assessed four times in an academic year (pre-midterm, midterm, post- midterm & Final Examination)
- Students of Class XI & XII will be assessed three times in an academic year.
- Final Examinations for Classes IX & XI will be in the month of January and that of Class III to VIII will be held in March.
- Final Examination for Class X and XII will be conducted by CBSE in Feb/March and the results will be declared at the end of May or in the beginning of June.
- For appearing in the Final examination, all the school dues should be cleared by the 10th of February.
- Students using or attempting to use Unfair Means in any test/ examination will be awarded zero in the entire test/examination.
- Students remaining absent in the assessment will not be awarded any marks.
- **For General Proficiency Award, actual marks secured by the student will be taken into account. A student who remains absent in any assessment will not be eligible for General Proficiency Award.**

The student's performance for each subject will be assessed using the actual marks scored and the same will be later converted into the grades as detailed below:-

Promotion to Class XII will be decided on the basis of the following:

- To be promoted to the next class a student should secure minimum 35% marks in each of the five scholastic subjects in the Final Examination and in the subject aggregate
- A student should secure Grade above E in all the Non Scholastic subjects.
- A student should secure minimum 35% marks in theory and practical examination separately, if the subject involves practical.
- A student will be allowed to appear for an Improvement Exam in any one of the five scholastic subjects, if he /she secure less than 35% in that subject and gets minimum 40% marks in aggregate.
- A nine point scale is followed for converting marks into letter grade for classes X to XII. The grades are derived from actual score from the student. The nine grades are awarded after rank ordering all the students in the class.
- This is done separately for each subject as follows:
 - A1- Top 1/8th of passed candidates.
 - A2- Next 1/8th of passed candidates.
 - B1- Next 1/8th of passed candidates.
 - B2- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - C1- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - C2- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - D1- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - D2- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - E- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
